Equity

Many residents don't have a choice and walk out of necessity

- There is often an emphasis on adding bike lanes, but we need to remember those who don't have bikes

Success Story: Sunset Ridge



Hickey Blvd & Iverness Dr

- Installed Curb extensions with paint and flexible delineators.
- Painted high-visibility crosswalks and added advanced limit lines.


Inverness Dr & Horizon Way

- Added a high-visibility crosswalk on Horizon Way at Inverness Drive, stop line, and ADA compliant curb ramps.
- Added a high-visibility mid-block crosswalk across Inverness Drive in front of the school, installed ADA compliant curb ramps, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs), and shark teeth pavement markings to inform drivers to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk.
- Added bicycle boulevard signs and pavement markings along Inverness Drive, including 25 mph markings.
